"The Creation of the Legal Self in Early Imperial China"

Grace Fong is a Professor of Chinese Literature in the Department of East Asian Studies at McGill University. Her research encompasses classical Chinese poetry and poetics, women writers of late imperial China, and autobiographical writing in pre-modern China. Her publications include the monograph *Herself an Author: Gender, Agency, and Writing in Late Imperial China* (2008) and the co-edited volume *The Inner Quarters and Beyond: Women Writers from Ming through Qing* (2010).

Robin Yates is James McGill Professor of East Asian Studies and History and Classical Studies at McGill University. He is a specialist on the social and cultural history of early China, the history of Chinese military science and technology, the history of Chinese women, and the history of Chinese law. Among his publications are Women in China from Earliest Times to the Present: A Bibliography of Studies in Western Languages (2009) and the co-authored book *Law, State, and Society in Early Imperial China* (2015).
